## WORKSHOP 1 COMPARATIVES

COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES	Form	Example
one syllable	Adj + <i>-er</i>	tall + <i>-er</i> = taller
two syllables ending in <i>-y</i>	<i>-y</i> changes to <i>-i</i> + <i>-er</i>	happy + <i>-er</i> = happier
two syllables (not ending in <i>-y</i> )	<i>more</i> + Adj	<i>more</i> + famous = more famous
three (or more) syllables	<i>more</i> + Adj	<i>more</i> + beautiful = more beautiful

**Example:**

She is taller than her sister.  
 John is **thinner than** Mike.  
 My office is **larger than** hers  
 Her hair is **curlier than** mine  
 Today is **hotter than** yesterday

Rule...	adjective	superlative
1. add "the -est"	rich long	the richest the longest
2. Drop -y, add "the -iest"	funny crazy	the funniest the craziest
3. C+V+C = doubles last consonant	fat big	the fattest the biggest
4. 2 or + syllables add THE MOST	beautiful dangerous	the most beautiful the most dangerous
5. Irregular forms (memorize)	good bad	the best the worst

Adjectives with one syllable, add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>cold</b> "January is often <u>the coldest</u> winter month."	Adjectives with two or more syllables, add: 'the' + 'most'	<b>ex-pen-sive</b> "This book is <u>the most</u> expensive book in the store."
Adjectives with two syllables that end in '-y', change '-y' to 'i' and add: 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>hap-py</b> "John is <u>the happiest</u> person I know."	Adjectives that end in a single vowel and consonant: double the final letter before adding 'the' + '-est' (or '-st')	<b>big</b> "Brazil is <u>the biggest</u> country in South America."
